UNIFORMS AND DISTRIBUTION SCHEDULE

There are two uniforms: Field Uniform (for games and competitions) and Classic Uniforms (for parades, concerts and other appearances). Fall athletes only get Classic uniforms, these uniforms will be distributed after the Tattoo

Field uniforms will be distributed during band camp, according to the following schedule (distribution begins at 4:00pm each day)

Monday, 8/20	Seniors
Tuesday, 8/21	Juniors
Wednesday, 8/22	Sophomores
Thursday 8/23	Freshmen

Costs:

Cleaning Fee:	\$20 for Percussion and Pipers (this will include the field uniform) \$15 for All Others
Shoes:	\$40 (all freshmen, others if needed)
Black Socks (to the knee):	\$5 (suggest at least 2 for anyone with a kilt and guard)
White Gloves:	\$5 (all except percussion wear them - suggest 2 pair, some use 3)
Garment Bag:	\$20 (bags have WM Highlander Band on them so they are easy to spot)

Please calculate your total and send cash or a check made payable to "WMBPA" (West Milford Band Parents Association). Please note, no uniform is released without payment!

What your students can expect:

- Day of fitting: -Students are sized and fitted for uniforms
- Students try on shoes and gloves for sizing. They will be ordered and distributed at a later date by Dr. McLaughlin
- Once paid, student take home uniform, socks, and garment bag

Things to remember:

- 1) Have your student write down their uniform number for all pieces. They must return all items or them will be charged for missing pieces.
- 2) When you dry clean (and you should every couple of weeks), **DO NOT dry clean the plaids or the rain coat.** The rain coats can be machine washed and line dried so they don't lose their repellent.
- 3) The band camp t-shirt is part of the uniform and must be worn. This helps preserve the uniforms from perspiration and deodorants.
- 4) Students may not have any food or drink that could cause stains when they are in uniform.
- 5) No facial piercings or Public Displays of Affection (PDA) while in uniform. When in uniform they represent WMHS

FUNDRAISING NEWS

We offer many fundraising opportunities for the students to participate in and raise money to help offset their costs of any trips and the many activities that are made available to them. Students earn all but 1% of funds raised to be put into their band account. The WMBPA keeps 1% of funds raised to help offset the cost of running the organization; equipment repairs, insurance, etc... TIPS FOR A NEW BAND PARENT

Welcome to the wonderful, crazy world of Marching Band! Yes! Its going to be hot on the blacktop! YES! The days are going to be long! YES! There are a million pieces to the uniforms! And YES – your child can do this! Hopefully the tips below will help you acclimate with ease! Know that it will be overwhelming at first but you will soon be amazed at how quickly both your child - and you - will rise to the occasion.



- The Band's motto is **"Early is on time, on time is late, and late is inexcusable."** Following this simple rule will help everyone get off on the right foot!
- For Band Camp, remember the following: WATER. SUNBLOCK. HATS. SUNGLASSES. MORE SUNBLOCK.
- Make sure you sign up for Dr. Mac's School Notes – this and the WMBPA Facebook page is how information will be disseminated
- Typically, Dr. Mac sends out a School Notes email blast the early part of the week (usually by Tuesday/Wednesday) prior to an upcoming game/competition. This will give you the time the students are expected at the school, what pieces of the uniform are needed, information about the venue, directions and the estimated arrival time back to the band room

- All important information that the students need will ALSO be placed on the dry erase board in the band room and students are reminded to check the board.
- After a game or competition, it is a good idea to have your student text you when they are heading back to the school so you have an idea what time to be there for pickup.
- Keep in mind that once the students arrive back at the school, they need to help unload the trucks and put the larger instruments and props away, so allow for an additional 20-30 minutes before your child can depart.
- Most of the competitions charge approximately \$10-\$12 for spectators with the exception of the Yamaha Cup, State and National Competitions, where tickets are about \$20-\$25. Dr. Mac may have advance discounted tickets for some of the events and he will let you know that as it gets closer to the event via School Notes.
- Candy Grams/Air Grams: Many of the competitions will sell candy and air grams as a way for you to celebrate your child's success. The Candy Grams will be distributed on the bus ride home or at band the next day. The Air Grams are announced as the Band takes the field.
- Students are expected to bring their uniforms in garment bags to school on game/competition days.
- It is a good idea for your child to have a large insulated thermos for water during Band Camp, Band Practice and games and competitions, as well as a small cooler bag, big enough to hold a sandwich, salad, drink and snack.
- Students should be prepared to bring food with them for games and/or competitions. They don't always have a lot of time to eat, so eating on the bus on the way to the event is not uncommon. Avoid dark colored foods or drinks that could stain uniforms!
- Students always ride to and from the events on the school bus. Permission must be obtained from Dr. Mac if alternate plans are needed.
- Students will be given a band tshirt during Band Camp. This is part of the uniform and should be worn under the uniform along with shorts or leggings so they can change quickly for each of the events.
- **Come out and support the Band! Don't forget to wear your Highlander Black and Gold!**

Band Camp BBQ (August)

Help feed the kids and staff after a long week of Band Camp to give them the energy they will need for the first official performance for the parents. Volunteers are needed as follows:

Week prior– help to purchase food and supplies

Day of BBQ organize, cook, distribute food and clean up. Volunteers will also assist in distributing t-shirts prior to the performance.

This year's Band Camp BBQ is on Friday August 24th and we need your help!! We are starting set up around 2 pm to feed the kids around 4:00-4:30 pm, with the Parent Show to follow at 6:00 pm on the Turf Field. Clean-up help is needed before and possibly after the Parent Show.



Band Banquet (May)

The Band Banquet is the annual awards dinner held to recognize the efforts and hard work of the students in Marching Band, fall and Indoor Guard, Indoor Percussion, Pipes and Drums and the Jazz Ensembles. The Banquet is held the day after the West Milford Memorial Day Parade. Volunteers are needed to assist with set up the evening on the event which includes placing the table decorations, setting up the table for the student gifts, and the creation of the picture boards to commemorate the seniors and the events of the year.

WANTED

Cheesecake Sale (August/September)

Students participate in the Ashley Farms Cheesecake Sale in the fall. The company will provide information and sales incentives at Band Camp. Volunteers will be needed to organize the sale by collecting order/sales packets, preparing for the receipt of the items. Due to the nature of the product, (cold or frozen), sorting and distributing will take place immediately after school on the day of delivery in late September.



Concession Stand (On-going August-November)

The Concession Stand at the Football Field is owned by the Band Parents Association and provides a major source of income for the Band– and great food for all – during Marching Band season. Any and all help is needed for home game days, and we will work around your availability! Volunteers are needed to clean and make any necessary repairs to the stand prior to the beginning of the season. Volunteers are also needed to purchase, prepare and sell concessions. Shopping is conducted on Thursdays, with trips to Restaurant Depot and BJ's. And we are seeking all you grillers, sous chefs and chefs to help cook and serve food to the hungry crowds! Prep begins at approximately 1:30 pm on game days, and work continues as we feed the students after practice, through pre-game, half-time and post-game cleanup. Whether you can assist early, late or throughout, the more the merrier and all help is appreciated! Just let us know what your schedule allows so we can ensure we have enough coverage.

Color Guard/Band Café (August)

Held during the week of Band Camp. Volunteers are needed to help organize, set up, serve students and staff lunch with clean up to follow. It's a great opportunity to meet the students and see who your student is paling around with while raising money for the program.

Equipment Crew (On-going August – May)



Get your exercise and the best seat in the house by joining the Crew! Volunteers are needed to assist the students move, load and unload instruments; equipment and props into the Equipment Trucks and buses, and help the Band take the field during home and away halftime performances and competitions. Crew Members also march with the Band (carrying water) for the St. Patrick's Day and Memorial Day Parades. Crew Members watch the shows from field level, and since they are "with the band", are also permitted to enter competitions and games for free. Regular availability is appreciated however, we accept any and all help and like the Concession Stand Crew, we will work around your availability! Just like concession, let us know your availability so we can be sure we have enough coverage.

There will be a Crew meeting on August 23rd following the Band Parent Meeting.

50/50 Raffle (August-November and February – May)

Held twice a year, volunteers are needed to help mail raffle tickets to our band families, sell and collect tickets/money throughout the sale and organize the raffle draws held at the Tattoo in November and the Spring Concert held each May.

Food/Drink/Supply Donations (ongoing)

In addition to volunteering for one of our committees, help is always needed throughout the year with donations of food, drinks and supplies for our various events. Requests for these needs will be posted on our Facebook page and Sign up Genius.

General Volunteer: (on-going)

A great place to sign up to give a hand with odds and ends, especially when we are swamped, and you are available! You will be contacted based upon the needs of the organization to assist in helping things run smoothly.



Hoagie Sale (January/February)

What better way to help fundraise and cater Super Bowl parties than by making Band Hoagies? Volunteers are needed both prior to and on the morning of Super Bowl Sunday. Hoagie Captains are needed to organize sale and purchase supplies. Volunteers are needed for "Fluffing Day" to weigh cold cuts/cheese, organize trays, and slice onions on the day or two before Super Bowl. Volunteers are needed the morning of Super Bowl Sunday to pick up bread and to assist students in assembling and packaging the hoagies themselves. Please note that all students who sell hoagies are required to help with assembly. But don't worry, you will be done with plenty of time to deliver - and eat - your hoagies well before game time!

Hospitality (December and May)

After the winter and spring band concerts, light refreshments are provided at a reception in the Cafeteria. One or two volunteers are needed to order and pick up a cake at Shop Rite, make coffee and iced tea or lemonade for the reception. Set up, serve and clean up after both concerts.

Indoor Color Guard Show (January)



Our Indoor Color Guard kicks off their season with a Preview show which includes many attending schools. Similar to our annual Tattoo, this is a huge fundraiser for the program. Volunteers are needed leading up to the event to plan and organize the concession stand. On the day of the event, help is needed with Security, Food Prep, Concessions, Merchandise Sales, Ticket Sales. Any and all help is appreciated. Please note if you have a specific interest or sign up as a general volunteer.

Indoor Percussion Marathon (January)

Indoor Percussion Students and Staff hold an annual fundraising marathon where they practice from early morning till night getting ready for finals. Volunteers are needed to help organize, set up, serve the students and staff with clean up to follow.

Indoor Percussion Show (February)

Our Indoor Percussion hosts a competition for the other groups in the Tri-State area. Similar to our annual Tattoo, this is a huge fundraiser for the program. Volunteers are needed leading up to the event to plan and organize, security, lunch for the judges, concession stand. On the day of the event, help is needed with Security, Food Prep, Concessions, Merchandise Sales, Ticket Sales. Any and all help is appreciated. Please note if you have a specific interest or sign up as a general volunteer.



Jazz Festival Show (May)

Our Jazz program hosts one of the largest festivals in New Jersey with bands from all over attending this two day event. Volunteers are needed the days of the event to set up, work concession, clean up, sell tickets, hand out programs, etc.... Any and all help is appreciated. Please note if you have a specific interest or sign up as a general volunteer.

Macopin Band Day (September/October)

Introduce the next generation of Highlanders to the excellence that is the Highlander Marching Band by helping at Macopin Band Day. Volunteers are needed to organize, serve and clean up a dinner provided to the Band and their 8th Grade guests. This dinner occurs prior to the 8th graders traveling with the Band to a Competition during the fall season. Help is also needed to chaperone and prepare goody bags for the 8th graders.

Merchandise (on-going August – June)

Help students and families show their Highlander pride and spirit! We sell WM Highlander Band branded merchandise (shirts, sweatshirts, hats, car magnets, varsity jackets and of course plaid!). Volunteers will collect orders, organize the ordering process and work with the merchandise suppliers. Volunteers are also needed to sell merchandise at the annual Tattoo, concerts and Indoor shows.

Parent Prep Crew (August)

Handy volunteers are needed to help build sets and modify uniforms and silks for the upcoming marching band show.

Pizza Sale (on-going, fall and spring sales)

Volunteers will assist in organizing the Eyes on the Pie Bar Pizza sales during the year. Volunteers will be needed to organize the sale by collecting order/sales packets, contacting distributor, preparing for the receipt of the items, and sorting and distributing on the day of delivery. Due to the nature of the product, (frozen), items will be distributed immediately after school.

Poinsettia Sale (November/ December)

Poinsettias are sold by students for pick up at the Winter Concert in December. Prior to distribution, the plants will be used to decorate the stage to bolster the holiday spirit! Volunteers are needed to organize the sale, and to assist in the pickup and distribution of plants at the conclusion of the evening.

Publicity Committee (on-going)

Volunteers are needed to work with Corresponding Secretary to ensure positive press coverage for the Band's accomplishments by taking pictures, writing press releases and planning to advertise upcoming events and fundraisers.



Scholarship Committee (March – May)

The WMBPA awards a number of scholarships to graduating seniors who intend to pursue higher education. The Scholarship Committee consists of two parents each from the Freshman, Sophomore and Junior classes. The members review the applications and essays submitted by the Seniors and ultimately recommend and select the award recipients.

Senior Night (Fall)

Seniors and their families are honored at a dinner reception and pre-game festivities prior to the conclusion of the marching band season. Volunteers are needed to plan the event, decorate, order and pickup dinner and refreshments, and obtain and distribute gifts and/or flowers to the students and parents. Help will also be needed to cover the Concession Stand so that Senior Parent volunteers can participate in the festivities on the field.



St. Patrick's Day – Parent Bus (March)

Each year our students have the honor of marching up 5th Avenue in the NYC St. Patrick's Day parade. To accommodate our band families wishing to attend the parade, we charter a bus to take everyone in and out of NYC so that you can watch the parade in person. One or two volunteers are needed to organize the list of attendees, collect the money, pay the driver and make sure everyone is accounted for.

Shop Rite Gift Cards (year-round - on-going)

Help provide the gift that keeps giving! Students earn \$4 for every \$100 that is purchased in Shop Rite gift cards. Volunteers are needed to take orders and track the sale of the cards, obtain payment for same and work with the WMBPA Treasurer to credit accounts. Volunteers are also necessary to distribute cards to the purchasers.

Tag Day (December)

Usually held on the first weekend of December, students kick off the holiday season by playing selections (or spinning to the sounds) of holiday classics at various businesses throughout West Milford for donations. Volunteers are needed to contact local businesses seeking permission to perform, collecting and transporting proceeds throughout the morning, and acting as a chaperone at each location.

Uniform Committee (on-going)

Help the Committee that keeps the kids looking their best! Volunteers are needed to distribute and/or collect uniforms at various points of the year. Help is needed in August during Band Camp to measure students and assign appropriately sized uniforms, distribute uniform pieces, and process glove, sock, shoe and garment bag orders. This generally occurs in August during the late afternoon/early evenings of Band Camp. Help is also needed in collecting field uniforms and in distributing Classic Uniforms to all students, including fall athletes in late November/early December. Assistance is further needed in collecting Classic Uniforms at the end of the school year, and in transporting uniforms to be cleaned.
